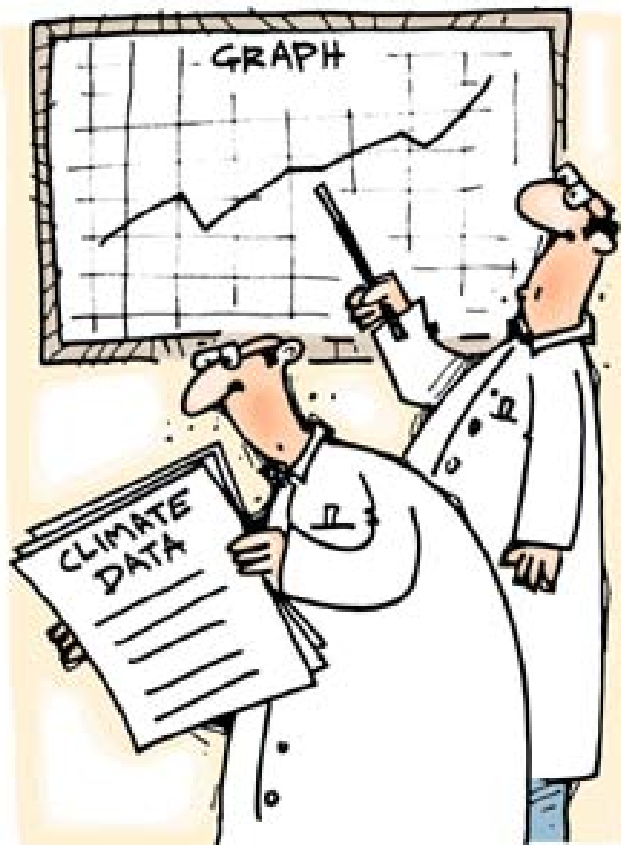


Question: how can decision-makers achieve their economic and social goals while simultaneously reducing the risk of dangerous climate change.

Six workstreams: cities, land use, energy, economics of change, finance and innovation.

Global Action Plan: strategic decision making, international agreements, phase out subsidies, carbon pricing, low-carbon infrastructure, scale up innovation, urban development, halt deforestation, restore land and forest, shift away from coal.

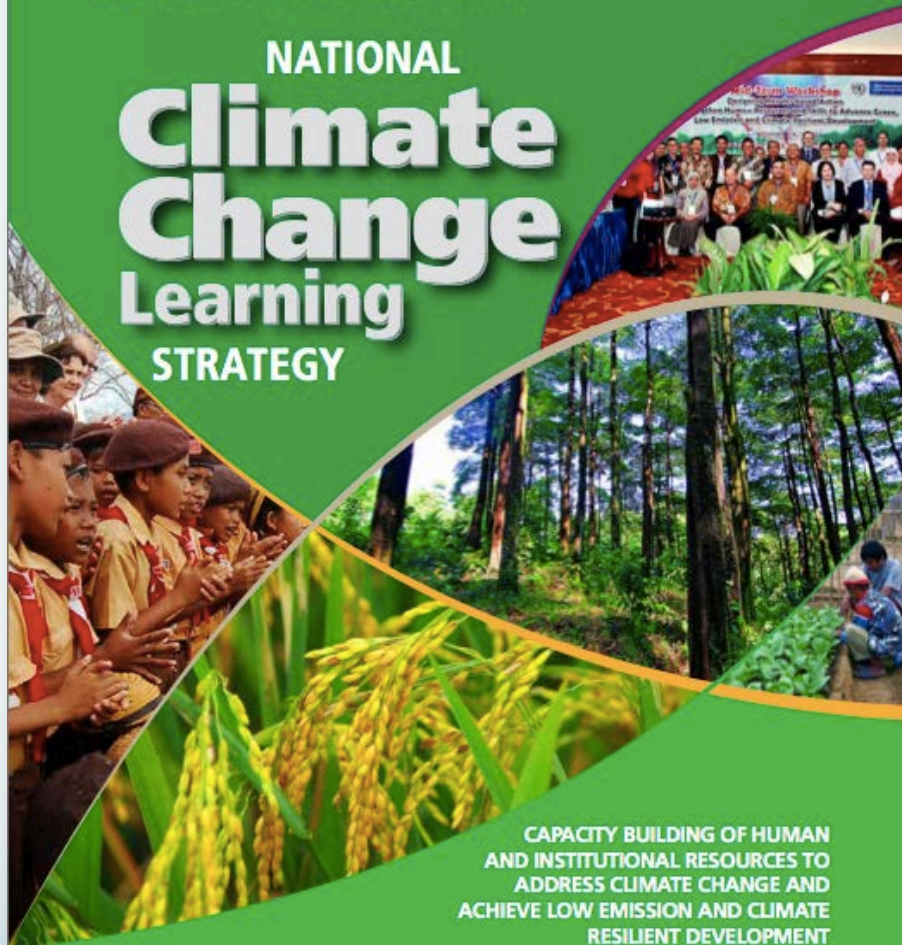
